Honorary Degree

Congratulation to **Dr. Bruce Robert Schnell**, BSP, MBA, PhD, FCSHP, who received an honorary Doctor of Science degree at the Thursday, June 4 convocation ceremony. Dr. Schnell joined the faculty in 1966 and was dean from 1976 to 1982. RESEARCH AND GRADUATE STUDIES

RESEARCH FUNDING

Great news: the College's research funding has increased nearly 400% from \$1.4M (2013-14) to \$5.3M (2014-15).

Congratulations to **Dr. Dave Blackburn** and Dr. Sharyle Fowler. They were awarded an Interdisciplinary Health Research Team Grant for Development and Evaluation of an Experiential Training Program for Pharmacy Students and Community-Based Preceptors to Improve the Quality of Healthcare for Patients with Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) in Saskatchewan.

Dr. Susan Whiting and her colleagues have been awarded a \$20,000 One Health Research Development Grant. Their project is a feasibility study of providing chickens to a community so young children will be able to eat "an egg a day" for protein and micronutrients in an otherwise poor quality diet.

Dr. Hassan Vatanparast was awarded a grant from the Children's Hospital Foundation of Saskatchewan for "The Impact of Vitamin D on Disease Activity in Canadian Children Who are Suffering from Juvenile Idiopathic Arthritis"
