



RESEARCH FUNDING

Hassan Vatanparast and his colleagues were recently awarded a one-year \$25,000 SSHRC Joint Initiatives grant to study the impact of socio-economic and cultural factors on household food security of Syrian refugees in Canada. He was also awarded a One Health Initiative team grant of \$15,000 for improving food security and nutritional status in the context of gender and ethnic inequities in Guatemala.

Gordon Zello and his colleagues were awarded a \$20,000 One Health Initiative team grant for the project "Community-based education intervention to improve knowledge of One Health drivers of malnutrition in Amazonian communities in Peru".
