Faculty and staff met on Friday, November 17 at the Willows Golf and Country Club to continue the strategic planning process for the college.



## **RESEARCH FUNDING**

Through the college's Research Infrastructure Program, **Anas El-Aneed** received \$35,950 for an Agilent HPLC system interfaced with an existing QTRAP 4000 mass spectrometer and **Ed Krol, Ellen Wasan, and Kate Dadachova** jointly received \$13,149 for maintenance and upgrade to four HPLC systems.

**Kate Dadachova** received a Saskatchewan Health Research Foundation (SHRF) Establishment grant in the amount of \$120,000 over 3 years for her study titled "Development of Novel Radiopharmaceuticals to Combat Systemic Fungal Infections".

**Meena Sakharkar** was awarded a 3-year \$120,000 SHRF Establishment grant for the project "Developing Combination Therapy to Treat Androgen-Insensitive Prostate Cancer".
