#### **CIHR and SHRF Grants**

**Dr. Charity Evans** (principal investigator), with co-investigator **Dr. David Blackburn** and their colleagues, were awarded \$282,865 over three years from the Canadian Institutes of Health Sciences for their project titled "Medication adherence in multiple sclerosis: a model for other chronic diseases."

Dr. Evans was also awarded \$78,700 over two years from the Saskatchewan Health Research Foundation for her project titled "Establishing the incidence and prevalence of multiple sclerosis in Saskatchewan."



#### **CIHR Master's Award**

Congratulations to **Katherine Ford**, who has been awarded a Master's Award: Frederick Banting and Charles Best Canada Graduate Scholarship by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. 
