#### **RESEARCH FUNDING**

**Jonathan Dimmock** and Mozart Marins from the University of Ribeirão Preto were awarded a \$12,200 grant from OVPR and the Sao Paulo Research Foundation for the project titled Synthesis and discovery of molecular mechanisms of some novel conjugated unsaturated ketones designed as anticancer agents.

**Holly Mansell** and her colleagues received \$25,000 from Ideas That Inspire, a partnered SHRF program with Lung Association, Saskatchewan for the project entitled Pharmacokinetics of Apixaban and Tacrolimus or Cyclosporine in lung transplant recipients.
