The college hosted the annual luncheon for the Home Economics alumni at the Delta Bessborough on Friday, April 27. Approximately 85 alumni from across the province attended.

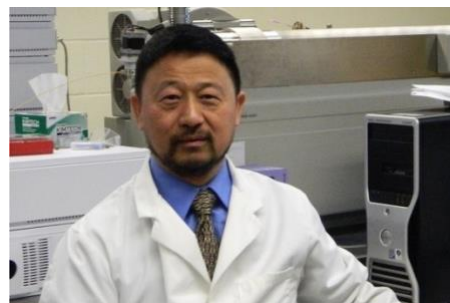
